MEDICARE SAVINGS PLANS

- QMB (Qualified Medicare Beneficiary) The state is required to pay Medicare premiums, deductibles and coinsurance for low income individuals with limited resources who are eligible for Medicare Part A. QMB pays the part B monthly premium, the Part B annual deductible, the Part A hospital deductible, and also covers the 20% of Medicare-approved charges for Part B services that Medicare does not pay. QMB does not cover prescription drugs. QMB works like a Medicare Supplement policy, but does more than a supplement as QMB pays the Part B monthly premium each month.
- **SLMB** (Special Low Income Medicare Beneficiary) A person with income too high to qualify for QMB may be eligible for SLMB. This program pays the Part B Medicare monthly premium. It does not pay medical copays or deductibles. To qualify, income must be equal to or less than 120% of the poverty level and the resource test must be met.
- QI (Qualified Individual) In this category the program will pay the Medicare Part B premiums for an individual who meets the income limit (between 120% and 135% of poverty) as long as federal funds are available.

MEDICAL EQUIPMENT

Medicare covers durable medical equipment needed for use in a patient's home. Some typical home care equipment and supplies are oxygen and respiratory care products, power wheelchairs and scooters, walkers, canes, crutches, hospital beds, and blood glucose monitors. Medicare will also cover the supplies needed for use with the equipment, such as test strips for use with blood glucose monitors.

GUIDELINES FOR OBTAINING DURABLE MEDICAL EQUIPMENT, PROSTHETICS, ORTHOTICS, AND SUPPLIES (DMEPOS):

- Patient must have Medicare Part B.
- Item must be on the Medicare approved list of covered equipment.
- Physician must prescribe equipment and complete paperwork.
- Determine if you area has been included in the competitive bidding program.
- Locate a supplier.
- Medicare pays 80% of its "approved" charge based on the new lower rates resulting from the competitive bidding process.

Visit www.medicare.gov and click on the "Find suppliers of medical equipment and supplies". Enter your zip code, and select the type of equipment needed. You will then be given a list of providers who are approved under the Medicare program to provide medical equipment. You can also contact Medicare at 1-800-633-4227. Your area may be part of the Competitive Bidding Program as well.

MEDICARE

Medicare is health insurance for people 65 or older, people under 65 with certain disabilities, and those of any age with End-Stage Renal Disease (ERSD).

When To Apply For Medicare

Enrollment into Medicare is handled in one of two ways: either you apply or you are enrolled automatically. To apply contact the Social Security Administration at 1-800-772-1213 three months before you turn 65 even if you have not retired yet. This is important to avoid any late enrollment penalties.

Automatic enrollment occurs if you have already started receiving your Social Security Retirement benefits, and Part A and Part benefits start the first day of the month you turn 65. If you receive Social Security disability or Railroad Retirement disability, your Medicare coverage should begin automatically after 24 months on disability.

MEDICARE SAVINGS PLANS

You may be eligible for assistance from the state to pay your Medicare premiums. There are four types of Medicare Savings Program:

QMB (Qualified Medicare Beneficiary) - helps pay your Part A and Part B premiums and other costs (like deductibles, coinsurance and copayments).

SLMB (Specified Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary) - pays the Part B premium only.

QI (Qualifying Individual) – pays the Part B premium only.

QWDI (Qualified & Working Individuals) – pays the Part A premium only.

Medicare Choices

Medicare gives you choices in how you get your health and prescription drug coverage. Learn as much as possible about types of plans and coverage options available to you. Things to consider include your health situation, and what you can afford. For most Medicare beneficiaries the choice of Medicare health plans is between the Original Medicare Plan and Medicare Advantage Plan.

<u>Original Medicare</u> – coverage provided by Medicare directly, you have your choice of providers that accept Medicare, you or your supplemental coverage pay deductibles and co-insurance, you usually pay a premium for Part B.

You will need to decide if you want prescription drug coverage.

You will need to decide if you want supplemental coverage.

<u>Medicare Advantage</u> (Part C) - private insurance companies approved by Medicare provide this coverage, must utilize for most plans the network of providers or you may have to pay some or all of the costs, you may pay a monthly premium (in addition to your Part B premium), deductibles, copayments, or coinsurance for covered services, and costs, extra coverage, and rules vary by plan.

You will need to decide if you want prescription drug coverage. If you want drug coverage and it is offered by your Medicare Advantage Plan then, in most cases, you must get your coverage through your plan. In some types of plans that don't offer drug coverage, you can join a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan.

If you join a Medicare Advantage Plan, you can't use Medicare Supplement Insurance to pay for out-of-pocket expenses you have in the Medicare Advantage Plan. If you already have a Medicare Advantage plan, you can't be sold a Medicare Supplemental Insurance policy.

Prescription Drug Coverage

Once you have chosen either Original Medicare (with or without Medigap coverage) or a Medicare Advantage Plan the next step is to decide if you want Medicare Part D prescription drug coverage. Part D is optional, but if you choose not to enroll when you are first eligible, you will have a monetary penalty if you choose to enroll at a later date. You can delay signing up for Part D without penalty if you have "creditable" prescription drug coverage through an employer or union, that is expected to pay at least as much as Medicare's standard drug coverage.

The annual open enrollment period for enrolling into Part D coverage is October 15 – December 7 of each year.

If you choose Original Medicare and want prescription drug coverage you must choose, and enroll in a stand-alone Medicare Part D Prescription Drug Plan. Medicare Advantage Plans offer prescription drug coverage for an additional monthly cost. If you join a Medicare Advantage Plan you must enroll in that company's prescription drug plan.

After you enroll into a Medicare drug plan, the plan will mail you membership materials, including a card to use when you get your prescriptions filled. You will pay part of the cost of each drug, either a flat fee or a percentage of the drug cost. Some plans may offer coverage through the "coverage gap".

Coverage Gap: Most Medicare Part D plans have a coverage gap or "donut hole". The gap begins after you and your drug plan together have paid a certain amount for covered drugs. Once you enter the coverage gap you pay a percentage of the plan's cost for covered brand name and generic drugs until you reach the end of the coverage gap. Not everyone will enter the coverage gap because their drug costs will not be high enough. The following items all count toward getting out of the coverage gap: yearly deductibles, coinsurance, and copayments; the discount you get on covered brand-name drugs in the coverage gap; what you pay in the coverage gap. The drug plan premium and what you pay for drugs that are not covered do not count toward getting out of the coverage gap. Over the next few years there will be increasing coverage for brand-name and generic drugs in the coverage gap until the gap completely closes in 2020.

Extra Help for Prescription Drug Coverage

If you have limited income and resources, you may be eligible for extra help from Medicare to pay for prescription drug costs. You apply for extra help through the Social Security Administration. Individuals who qualify get the following:

- Help paying the monthly Medicare Part D premium.
- Help paying the annual deductible for drugs.
- Help paying prescription drug coinsurance and copays.
- No coverage gap or "donut hole".
- No late enrollment penalty.

NURSING HOMES

Nursing home care is an important component in the total system of longterm care services for the elderly and disabled. The 60-page "Guide to Choosing a Nursing Home" is available from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. You can read the guide online at www.medicare.gov. Type "Guide to Choosing a Nursing Home" in the search bar in the upper right hand corner. The guide can be ordered by calling 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227).

Levels of Care

Skilled care provides care 24 hours- a- day including nursing services for a person with serious health-care needs and can include high-level wound care, respirator, tube feeding, intravenous therapy and more. Rehabilitation services are also available.

Intermediate care provides less extensive care than skilled care. Nursing and rehabilitation services are provided but not 24-hours-a-day. Medical supervision and help with personal care is provided but not skilled care.

Payment Options

Original Medicare pays for a limited amount of skilled nursing facility care if it is deemed medically necessary and the patient was admitted to a hospital for at least 3 days (the day of discharge is not counted) for the medical reason in which skilled facility care is needed. Generally, Original Medicare will pay all costs for the first 20 days. A coinsurance per day will be charged for days 21-100, and after 100 days Original Medicare pays nothing.

Original Medicare does not pay for intermediate care. CHOICES for Long Term Care will cover medically necessary intermediate care for financially and medically eligible patients. If you need nursing home care paid by CHOICES you must be income and medically eligible. If you already have Medicaid call the phone number listed on the back of your Medicaid card. If you do not have Medicaid contact the East TN Area Agency on Aging and Disability at 1-866-836-6678 for more information and to apply for CHOICES. At an extra cost some systems will provide reminders about medications, doctor's appointments, blood sugar checks, meals, etc.

Established in 1996, the TRA was created to meet the challenge of the changing telecommunications and utility environment. The Agency's assistance and consumer protection programs assist consumers targeted by unfair utility practices and aid consumers that are in need of telephone assistance.

Example of some services include:

- CapTel is a telephone service that allows the user to speak, read captions and hear as they maintain business and personal telecommunications. CapTel is a free service that is available to all Tennesseans.
- •TDAP is designed to distribute appropriate telecommunications devices so that persons who have a disability may effectively use basic telephone service. One service available through TDAP is the Clear Sound ER Phone with Wristband. The large button phone enables the user to program six emergency contact numbers into the phone in the event of an emergency. The client wears a necklace or wristband which can be pushed to summon help.

These devices / equipment are issued on a first-come, first-served basis. An application must be completed including a professional certification by a health-care worker with knowledge of the applicant's condition and appropriate documentation.

REHABILITATION SERVICES

Services include physical, occupational, respiratory, cardio, speech, and other kinds of therapy. Therapy can be provided on an inpatient basis in nursing homes, or at hospitals. Outpatient services are sometimes available through home health care agencies, nursing home, and private therapists. A physician must prescribe the needed services and the patient may choose the provider. For more information or referral, talk with your health care provider. Payers of rehabilitation services include Medicare, TennCare, private insurance, and private pay.

RESPITE CARE

Respite provides short-term relief for family caregivers by providing a trained substitute caregiver, either inside or outside of the home. **Adult day services** (pages 12-13) and **personal support services agencies** (pages 68-70). Some nursing homes, retirement centers, assisted living facilities and residential homes for the aged may offer respite services. Private pay and some long-term care plans may cover respite.

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
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
